The PhD Program

- Study with internationally recognized faculty from the standpoint of multiple disciplines, including: history, economics, philosophy, political science, psychology, and sociology.
- Enter with a small cohort of students pursuing either a PhD or a joint JD/PhD.
- Develop your skills in an integrated curriculum that provides disciplinary depth and interdisciplinary breadth across the social sciences, humanities, and law.
- Gain sophisticated quantitative and qualitative methodological training.
- Anchor your scholarship in a discipline and develop a topical specialty.
- In addition to JSP doctoral seminars, take courses at Berkeley Law and in top-ranked disciplinary programs across campus.

- While in JSP, all students receive:
 - ✓ a five-year, comprehensive financial support package;
 - ✓ yearly financial support for research and conference travel;
 - assistance in job placement: JSP has an excellent record of placement in top law and disciplinary/interdisciplinary programs.
